

National Day of Human Trafficking Awareness January 11, 2010

Human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery.

Victims of human trafficking are young children, teens, men and women. Approximately 600,000 to 800,000 victims annually are trafficked across international borders world wide, and between 18,000 and 20,000 of these victims are trafficked into the U.S. according to the U.S. Dept. of State.

Trafficking victims include U.S. citizens.

Victims of human trafficking are subjected to force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of sexual exploitation or forced labor. After drug dealing, trafficking of humans is the second largest criminal industry in the world, and the fastest growing.
